



2024 CIYC Overnight Race
Sailing Instructions

1 Rules

1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing, and the prescriptions of Sail Canada.

1.1 RRS Appendix G2 is modified to read:

Other boats *should* comply with the rules of their national authority or class association in regard to the allotment, carrying and size of insignia, letters and numbers. Such rules shall, when practicable, conform to the above requirements.

1.2 Appendix T, Arbitration shall apply.

2 Changes to Sailing Instructions

2.1 Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 1700 on September 14th.

3 Communications

3.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board (see NoR) and on the CIYC website.

3.2 On the water, the committee boat shall monitor VHF channel 72.

3.3 The failure of a boat to receive a VHF transmission from the committee boat is not grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1.

4 Signals Made Ashore

4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed on the deck of the CIYC club house.

4.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 20 minutes' in Race Signals AP.

5 Race Conditions

5.1 Races shall not be started if the average wind speed is less than 1 knot or more than 25 knots, or in the event of imminent thunderstorms. The determination of when a race shall not be run shall be at the discretion of the committee boat.

6 Courses

6.1 Addendum 2 of the NoR lists the courses which may be run.

6.2 No later than the 5 minutes before the warning signal, the committee boat shall announce the course to be sailed by VHF.

6.3 Courses shall not be shortened, and the course shall not be changed once announced by the committee boat.

7 The Start

- 7.1 The starting line is between the start/finish mark and the orange flag on the committee boat, or if there is no committee boat an orange drop mark.
- 7.2 Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area during the starting sequence for other races.
- 7.3 If any part of a boat's hull is on the course side of the starting line during the two minutes before her starting signal and she is identified, the committee boat will attempt to broadcast her sail number or name on VHF channel 72. Failure to make a broadcast or to time it accurately will not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1.
- 7.4 The start order shall be:
- PHRF Spinnaker and PHRF JOG A in a combined start.
 - PHRF JOG B in a separate start.
- 7.5 There may be a delay between the start signal of the first start and the warning signal for the second start.

8 The Finish

- 8.1 Boats shall finish by sailing as close as possible to the start/finish mark, and recording their time (GPS) with a photo of the mark to the race committee at the first available opportunity.

9 Time Limits & Discontinued Races

- 9.1 There are no time limits.

10 Hearing Requests

- 10.1 The protest time limit is 12 PM September 16th. Protests must be submitted to the CICY Race Committee or emailed to Kevin Alles at kevin.sailor@gmail.com
- 10.2 Hearing request forms are available on the CIYC website.
- 10.3 Notices will be posted no later than 2 days after the protest time to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or names as witnesses. Hearings will be scheduled with all named parties and be heard within 2 weeks at CIYC.

11 Safety Regulations

- 11.1 A boat that retires from racing shall notify the committee boat at the first reasonable opportunity.

12 Manual Power

- 12.1 Power-assisted winches and other devices are permitted for adjusting running rigging.
This changes RRS 52
- 12.2 Autohelms and self-steering devices are allowed
