DAILY

Wipe down Spider webs on deck railing and clubhouse-broom Wipe down spider webs on deck furniture-tables (round tables and deck picnic tables) and chairs-broom

Wipe deck table furniture with wet rag.

Use a broom to wipe down buildings and ceiling between outside washrooms and clubhouse.

Pavillion: Use a broom to wipe down all spider webs on structure.

Weed pavilion floor as needed.

Use a broom to wipe spider webs from furniture in pavilion.

Use a wet rag to wipe furniture in pavilion.

Use a broom to wipe down spider webs from al, picnic tables on the property.

Use a wet rag to wipe picnic tables-top and seats.

Weed pavers beneath tables as needed.

Clean outside carriage lights around the property-glass, etc. Wet rag
Use a broom to clean cob webs from carriage lights.

WEEDS, WEEDS—walkways, driveway, along fences—wherever!!!!

Weed outside gardens.

Remove/deadhead foliage from garden plants

Remove garbage from pails- to dumpster

Empty-washout recycle bins on deck

Hose down deck and cement as needed.

Clean outside windows, as needed.

Pick up sticks around property-as needed


Cut grapevines along area around floating docks

Hose down cement at north side of club by floating docks
